Citizens Forum Has Active Schedule

During its 2014-15 season, the Citizens Forum held seven separate events:

- 1) Medical Marijuana September 2014
 The panel discussed how medical marijuana centers are expected to operate with focus on the center scheduled to operate in Dennis by the William Noyes Webster Foundation.
- 2) Preparing Your Life Folio October 2014 Speaker Robert B. Mauterstock addressed the question: "If you were to have a life changing event from which you could no longer provide guidance, what would your loved ones do?" A subject Bob stressed is communication between parents and children to develop an "international financial plan that works."
- 3) Chat with the Chiefs December 2014
 Reminiscent of a "fireside chat," Orleans Police Chief
 Scott MacDonald and Orleans Fire and Rescue
 Chief, Tony Pike, discussed operations of their
 respective departments and some of the general
 public safety issues addressed widely in the national
 press.
- 4) Mental Health Autism January 2015
 The focus of the panel discussion was on an alternative for providing housing for autistic adults. Government funding only covers education until age 22 and aging parents are finding it difficult to provide the level of care they once did. One local organization, Cape Cod Village, Inc., is trying to address this issue by providing housing in Orleans.
 5) Police Station Building Study February 2015
 The panelists provided information to develop a

better understanding of the preliminary plans for the
Orleans Police Station Building. Included was a



presentation of the conclusions and recommendations of the Police Station Building Committee which was chartered by the Board of Selectmen.

6) Wastewater - April 2015

Panelists included representatives of the Orleans Water Quality Advisory Panel who have been working since Summer 2014 to define approaches, seek consensus and build widespread community support for a customized, affordable water quality management plan. The panel addressed progress to date.

- 7) Candidates Night April 2015
 Candidates Judith Bruce and incumbent John Hodgson provided opening and closing statements and responded to a myriad of questions at a packed Orleans Senior Center.
- 8) Annual Member Meeting June 2015

Over 700 attendees participated in these 7 forums as well as countless others who watched the videos of each session on the Citizens Forum website. Past events dealt with <u>Frauds and Scams</u>, <u>Beach Access and Nesting Plovers</u>, <u>Advanced Emergency Medical Services</u>, <u>Emergency Preparedness</u>, <u>Aging in Place</u>: <u>Obstacles and Opportunities</u>, <u>Homeless Prevention</u>, and <u>What's New for You in Cape Medical Care</u> among others.
