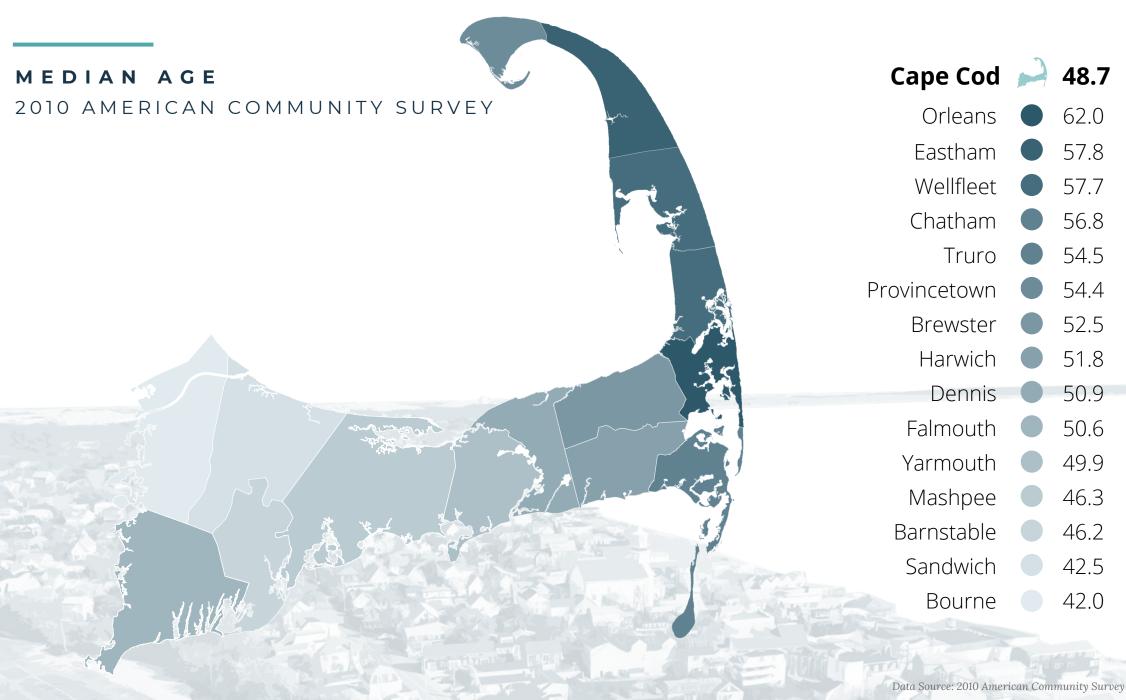


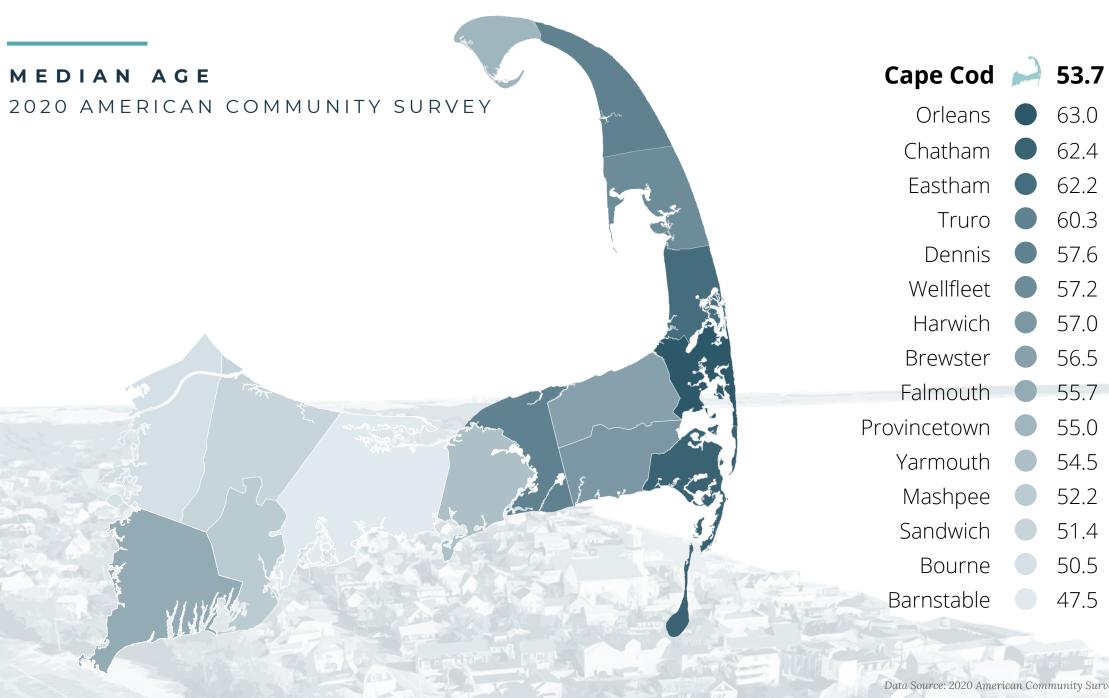
#### DEMOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY BY TOWN

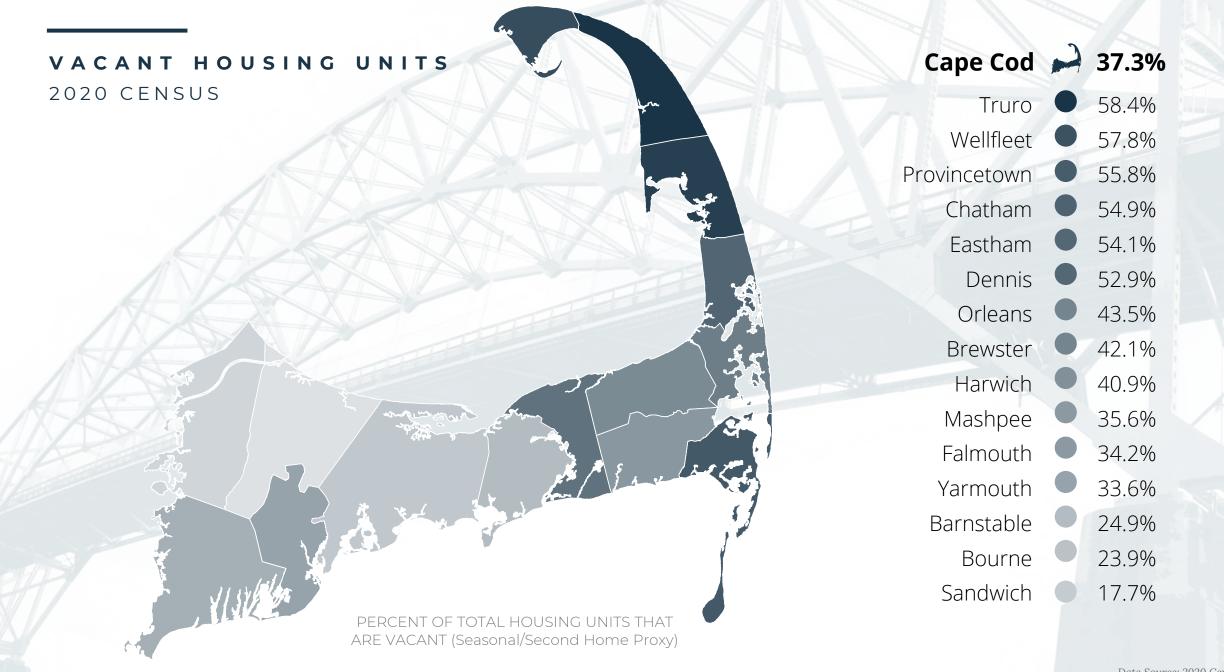

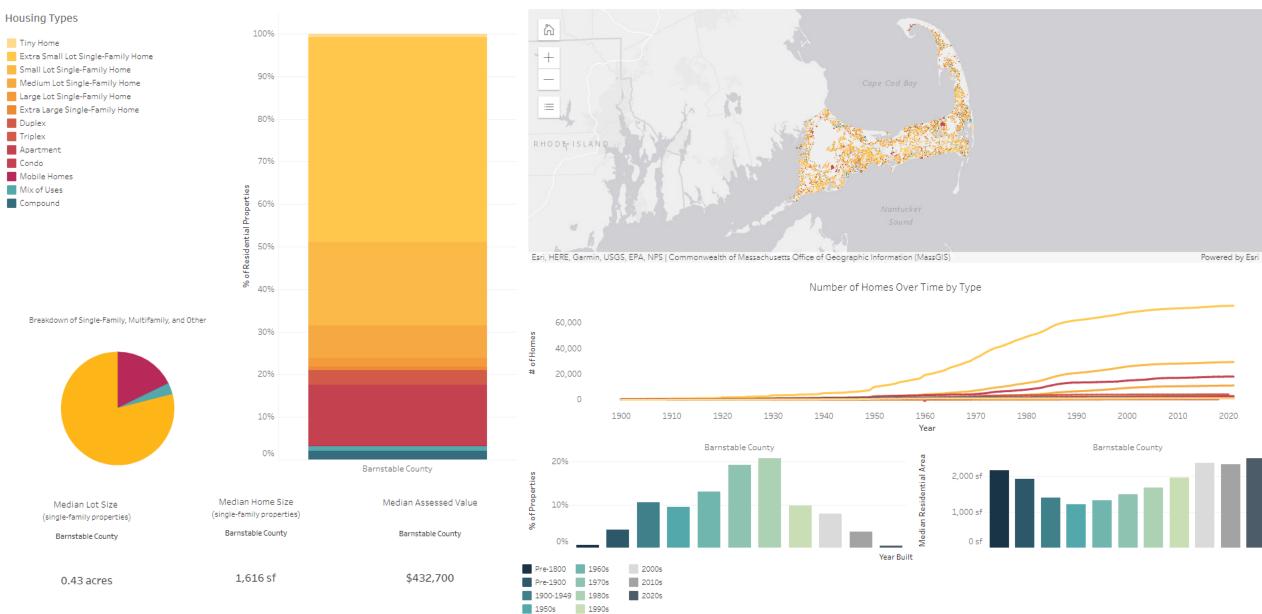

Cape Cod Housing Types



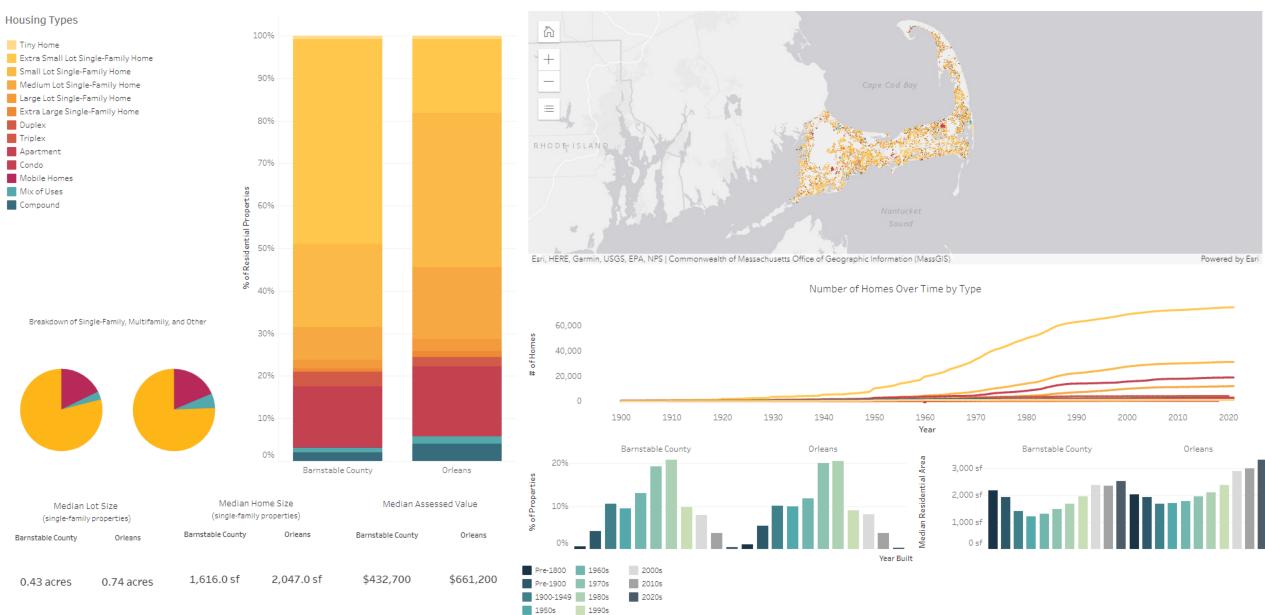


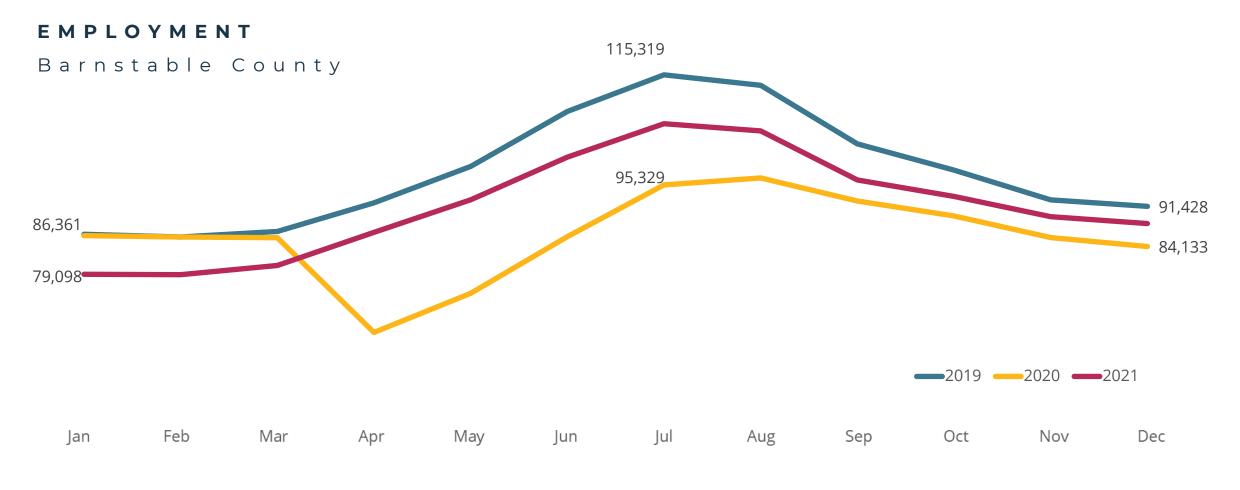

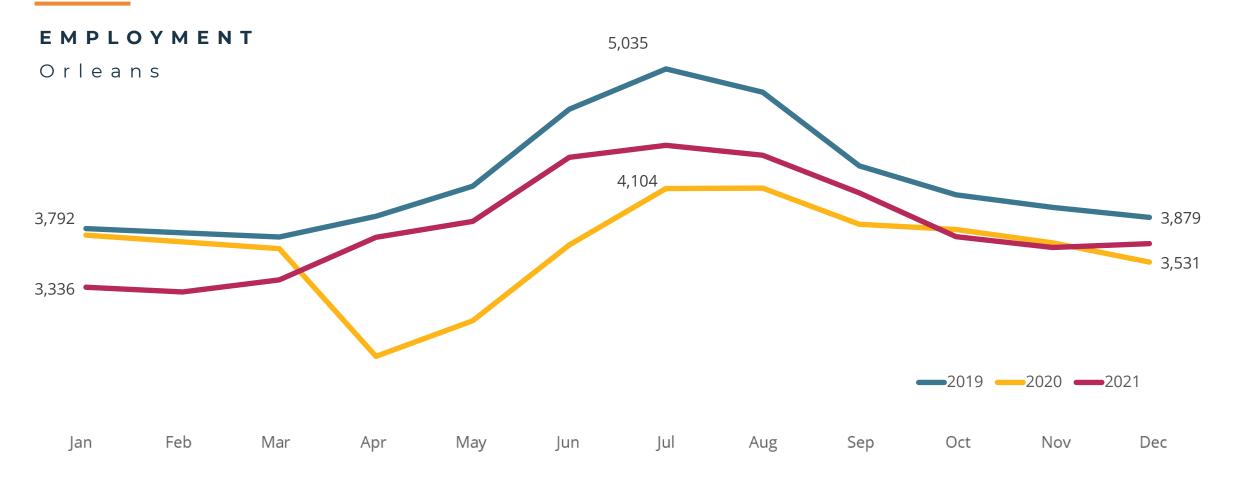

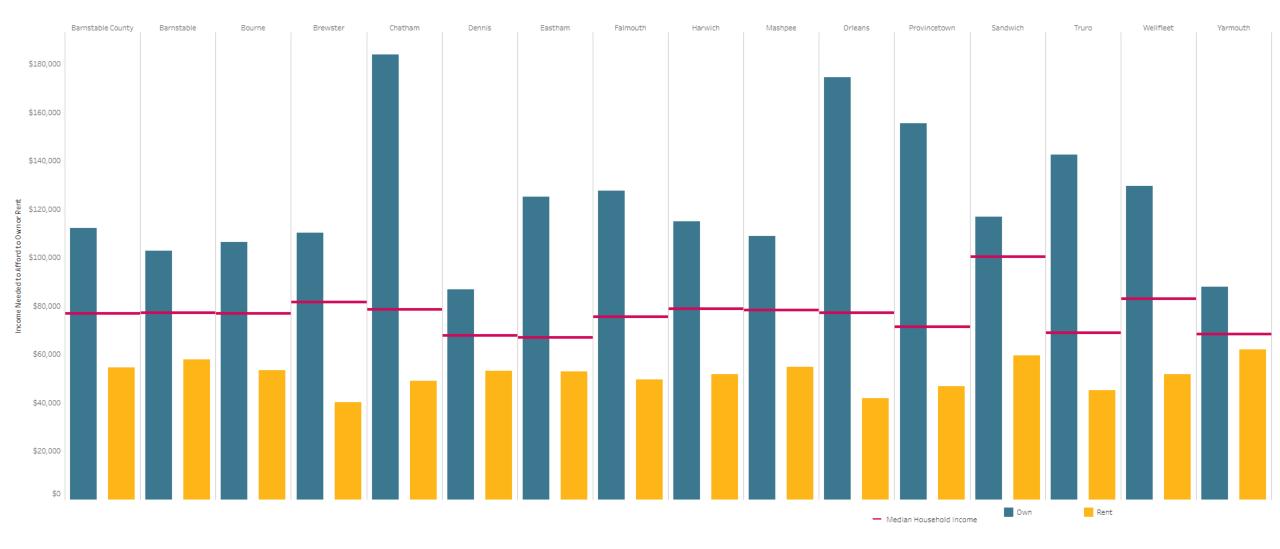

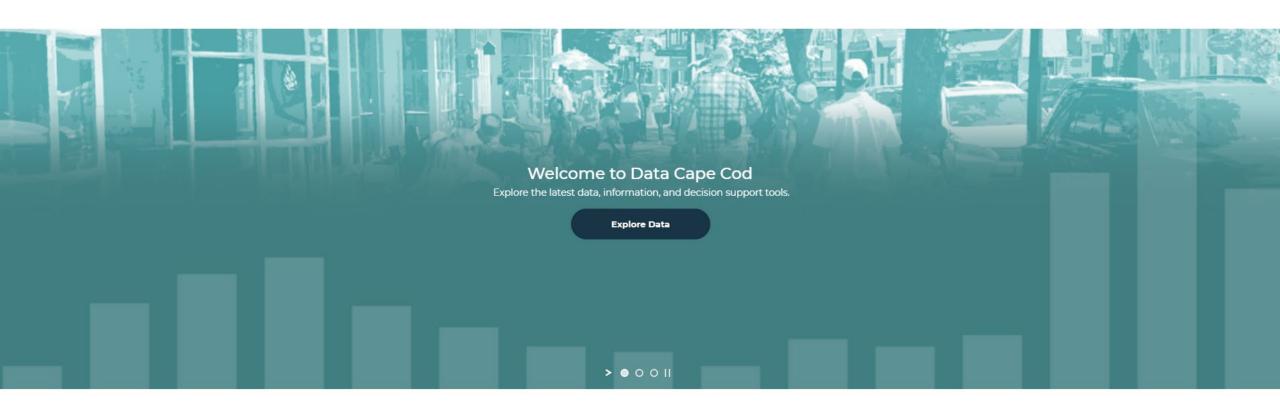

ACS data for the smaller towns may have large margins of error. Calculations assumed a 10% down payment and a 4.125% 30-year loan and used the NerdWallet mortgage calculator to estimate the monthly principal and interest payment. Calculations also used an insurance rate of \$4,\\$1000, and a mortgage insurance rate of \$45/\\$100,000. "Gross refers to the "contract rent plus the estimated average monthly cost of utilities (electric, gas, and water and sewer) and fuels (oil, coal, kerosene, wood, etc.) if these are paid by the renter (or paid for the renter by someone else)" according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

**Data Cape Cod** was created by the Cape Cod Commission to provide local and regional datasets to support planning efforts, economic development, and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. 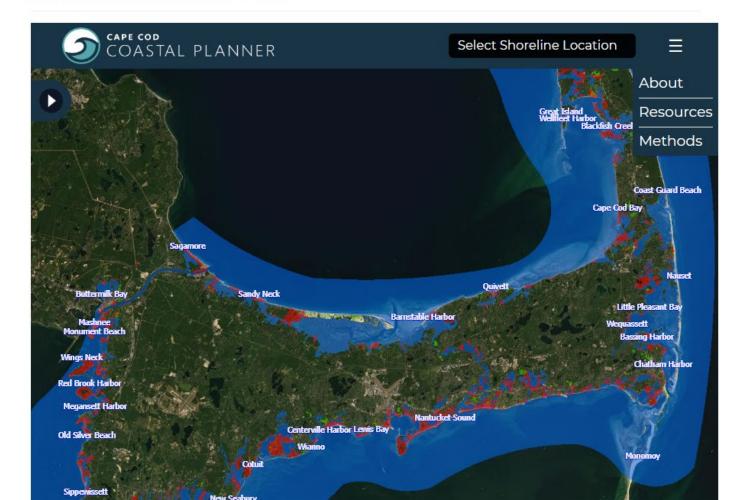


#### **Featured Datasets**



The Cape Cod Commission and its partners built the Cape Cod Coastal Planner, a map-based decision-support tool to help residents and decision-makers understand the relative environmental and socio-economic effects of implementing adaptation strategies to address sea level rise, storm surge, and erosion. The tool integrates research on potential adaptation strategies for Cape Cod communities and how ecosystem services are impacted by hazards and strategy selection. Development of the Cape Cod Coastal Planner was also informed by an extensive stakeholder process, integrating feedback from potential users across the region, and tested through a pilot project with the Town of Barnstable. The Cape Cod Coastal Planner is a product of the Resilient Cape Cod project.

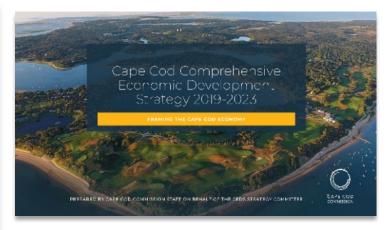
